
 Mario Valenzuela - Is very excited to get to know everyone and is excited to learn from everyone and will be available whenever to help and be there for our department and community.




 Juda Dominguez - First generation firefighter, is very grateful for the opportunity and is excited to learn from everyone and would like to do more ride-alongs.


